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Remove fork cap and remove drain screw






Remove the allen screw at the bottom of the fork



Now the fork is disassembled.













Note: Cut close to the same angle as the top of the spring This is what it should look like after the cut




Now the piston. i got two 2" bronze bushings 1" od and 3/4" id at the local hardware store.
Install on piston as shown









Reinstall top cap Note: These old springs i cut at 1 3/4 inches for some preload.

According to Olgraybeard the shocks don't bottom out and the stiffness/ride is pretty much same as stock.

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
